Stephen first worked at RDH during the summer of 2005 while still a student. When he finished his studies, he rejoined the company in 2006.

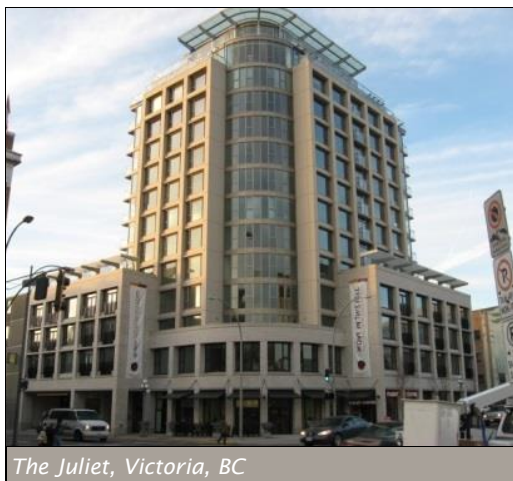
